
DATABASE SHOWCASE

ReadIt! is an EBSCO database focused on providing accessible reading resources to English Second Language learners and students with delayed literacy. Based around the Explora interface, ReadIt! is easy to navigate and helps support those working to improve their English-language proficiency.

Covering topics like advanced mathematics, American history, and athletics, there is something in *ReadIt!* for all subjects.

Beyond the classroom, *ReadIt!* also provides resources for adult English-language learners on topics including health resources and resume development.

MAGNOLIA users can access *ReadIt!* and many other great databases at no cost. Visit <u>magnolia.lib.ms.us</u> for more information.




MAGNOLIA user exploring ReadIt!
