

How to Submit a Comment to the FCC About E-Rate

The FCC is accepting public comments about the future of the E-Rate program.

Comment Deadline: October 13, 2026

Anyone may submit a comment. You do not have to be an E-Rate expert.

Easiest Option: Submit an Express Comment

1. Go to the FCC Comment Form

Use this link:

<https://www.fcc.gov/ecfs/filings/express?proceeding%5Bname%5D=26-133>

The E-Rate proceeding number, **WC Docket No. 26-133**, should already be entered.

2. Enter Your Information

Complete the information requested on the FCC form.

If you are commenting for yourself, use your own information.

If you are submitting a comment on behalf of a library or organization, make sure you are authorized to speak for that organization.

3. Write or Paste Your Comment

Your comment does not have to be long.

Tell the FCC:

- Who you are and what community you represent
- Why E-Rate matters to your library or community
- How people use your library's internet and technology
- What could happen if E-Rate support is reduced or ended

Personal examples and local information can help explain why E-Rate matters.

4. Review Your Comment

Before submitting, check:

- Your name and contact information
- The E-Rate proceeding number: **WC Docket No. 26-133**

- Your comment for spelling and accuracy

5. Submit Your Comment

Follow the instructions on the FCC form to submit your comment.

Save your confirmation information for your records.

Have a Longer Comment or a Prepared Document?

You may also upload a prepared comment through the FCC's Electronic Comment Filing

Choose the standard filing option and follow the FCC instructions to upload your document.
